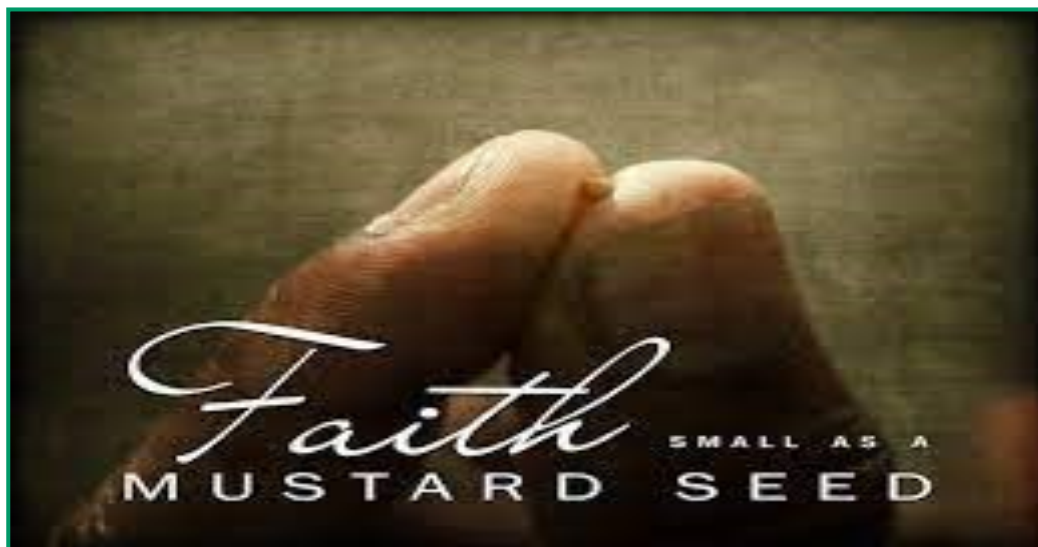

Joseph's Workbench

Hope Appeal for 2022 has begun! Our goal this year is \$76,603.52, this may seem like a lot but is based on our regular collection revenue over the last 3 years. The Hope Appeal funds many necessary needs for our parish and the whole diocese. Faith Formation here at St. Joseph is helped by the Hope Appeal, all the training that our catechists receive is funded through Hope Appeal. Health Care Ministry in hospitals and nursing homes is funded through Hope Appeal as well. I am an on-call chaplain at all hospitals in Onondaga County, but I only go in when called. The day to day ministry is done by lay and deacon chaplains (and one priest) who make sure patients receive communion and keep them in contact with their parishes.

Tuition assistance at Catholic schools is also funded by Hope Appeal, as is Campus Ministry at area colleges and universities. Social justice needs are also funded, food pantries receive assistance, as does Catholic Charities. One statistic that impressed me from the report of last year's Hope Appeal is that Catholic Charities found permanent housing for 147 people in 2021, which I find very impressive.

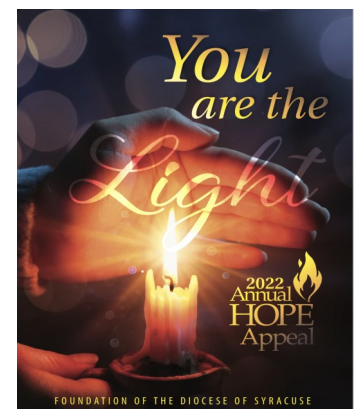
You should have received in the mail or will receive a donation envelope in the mail. If not, envelopes are available at church entrances. You can mail the envelopes with your donation or simply drop them in the collection. You can also give online at www.syracusediocese.org.

The amount of \$76,603.52 is doable by us all. If 1,000 people gave \$76 we would easily make our goal. There's one problem, we don't have 1,000 givers! If 500 people gave \$162 we could easily make the goal, but we don't have that many givers. If 200 people gave \$380 we could make our goal easily, and this is more in line with our giving numbers.

None of this is to tell you how much you can give, some can give more, some can give less, but if we all make a true sacrifice, we will meet our goal. All that is needed is that we all pray and think about what we can give and make a commitment.

Whatever you are able to give, thank you for your generosity.
