Joseph's Workbench

The pilgrimage to Lourdes of October 9 – 16 by 111 pilgrims, including me, was organized by Our Lady of Lourdes Hospitality North American Volunteers. This group, centered here in Syracuse, is dedicated to bringing volunteers to serve in the sanctuary at Lourdes, France, and to bringing the sick from the USA as pilgrims to Lourdes. Volunteers, including a medical team, all of whom pay their own way, travel to Lourdes, caring for our sick pilgrims so they can participate fully in all the activities in the sanctuary at Lourdes.

I grew up in a time when the story of Our Lady appearing to St. Bernadette in Lourdes was well known by American Catholics, especially through the movie (and book), “The Song of Bernadette” by Franz Werfel. Most younger American Catholics may have heard of St. Bernadette and Lourdes and yet know little of what happened there and what Lourdes is like as a center of pilgrimage and, yes miracles.

Bernadette Soubirous was a 14-year-old daughter of a very poor family in Lourdes, France, a village on the southern border of France with Spain, at the foot of the Pyrenees mountains. One day, February 11, 1858, Bernadette was gathering wood with her sister and another girl when she saw a vision of a lady, in a grotto, a hillside cave, in a wild area outside the Lourdes village. Bernadette later said she was very beautiful, wearing a dress and mantle of white with a blue sash and barefoot, with a golden rose on each foot. The woman did not speak, but when Bernadette returned for a visit, she began to speak and asked Bernadette to return for 15 visits. There were eventually 18 appearances between February to July 1858.

The lady's message was simple, “Penance, penance, pray for sinners.” She asked for a chapel to be built at the site by priests and for there to be processions. She had Bernadette dig in the grotto and this revealed a spring which flows to this day. Until the 16th appearance, the lady was unnamed, even though Bernadette, at the instruction of her parish priest, had asked the lady for her name. At the 16th appearance, on the Feast of the Annunciation, March 25th, the lady told Bernadette, “I am the Immaculate Conception.” Bernadette had never heard the term; she was uneducated and did not know it was a term referring to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

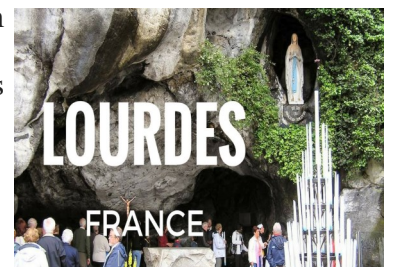
Bernadette never referred to cures being talked about by Our Lady in the vision, she merely instructed Bernadette to drink of the water from the spring and wash. But a few days after the spring water began flowing, healings began, some judged to be miraculous. Over the 160 years since the apparition there have been 70 healings judged to be miraculous, some at the “baths” where people wash in the spring water, some at the grotto, some during the Eucharist or Eucharistic processions at Lourdes and some by people praying to Our Lady of Lourdes at home, who've never been to Lourdes, France!

Yet, although the miracles are inspiring, and many go to Lourdes, hoping for, but not expecting a cure, Lourdes is more than that. It really is a holy place of prayer, and many spiritual graces are present at Lourdes. Peace, relief of past traumas, and a deepening and renewal of faith are all present there.

If you'd like to go on pilgrimage to Lourdes, Lourdes Volunteers is conducting another pilgrimage in June 2023. Lourdes Volunteers also conducts the “Lourdes Virtual Pilgrimage Experience” a live, in-person event at churches, schools, etc. Images, prayer, music, Benediction, procession with candles and receiving Lourdes water, and touching a rock from the Grotto at Lourdes are all part of this experience. I understand Cindy Heath, who also went on this pilgrimage, took many pictures on our pilgrimage and she hopes to post them on the parish website and our Facebook page. I hope they give you a sense of the wonderful experience, and that my images aren't too embarrassing!
