# Joseph's Workbench

I'm writing this column on Election Day, I voted, of course, and I returned from the experience very impressed by the good cheer and efficiency of the poll workers. There was a line when I arrived but the workers got us all through in about ten minutes! My polling place is our parish center, so I only had to walk across the parking lot, but there was a steady stream of cars.

Voting is a civic duty and part of what it means to be American. When the United States began only free white men could vote in most states, and even then there were property owning requirements to vote in most states. Yet even this limited franchise was revolutionary in 1788, the year of our first presidential and congressional elections under the new constitution. Almost all nations at this time were ruled by kings, and the idea of electing a national leader seemed foolish. George Washington stepped down voluntarily in 1797, a move that astonished the world, a leader voluntarily giving up power. In 1801 we had the first peaceful transfer of power from one political party to another in world history, John Adams accepting the results of a close election and recognizing Thomas Jefferson as the new president. It took a Civil War and amending the constitution and a nationwide civil rights movement in the 1960s before the promise of full voting rights for all Americans regardless of race or sex was fulfilled.

I know my lone vote is not able to shift the fate of the nation, state, or even locality where I vote. Yet my vote is one voice saying I believe in our system of government, even when I disagree with the outcome. Every vote counts because every election is thousands, no, millions of citizens participating in our government.

"Give honor to all, love the community, fear God, honor the king (1 Peter 2:17)." These words from the Bible show us that supporting our system of government is something we owe to God. These words of St. Peter are remarkable because he makes them when the Roman Empire, the government of the time, is persecuting Christians! Eventually even St. Peter himself would die a martyr in the arena under government of the Empire. Yet Peter still says we should honor government (the king), why?

The early Christians couldn't vote, they were persecuted, yet they knew government, even one that persecuted them, did good. The Empire enforced good laws, its armies defended the borders from barbarians, the Church, even with persecution, could spread the Gospel under the government of the Roman Empire.

We modern Catholic Christians should be thankful for our liberties and exercise all our rights as citizens to influence our government and society towards good, especially by bringing people to Christ. We may roll our eyes at mindless partisanship, does anyone believe those fifteen to thirty second attack ads? I hope no one bases a vote on what those ads say! No, our system is not perfect, but it is a government we all have a voice in.

Let's pray for our country, for all those who are elected and try to live those words of St. Peter, "Give honor to all, love the community, fear God, honor the king."
