A Happy and Healthy New Year to all! Should we also add to that traditional greeting that the new year be scam free? I was alerted by two parishioners that they had received emails in my name asking them to buy gift cards on the internet and send all the internet gift card info to the sender of this scam email. Neither email came from my two e-mail addresses: rhyde@syrdio.org or roberthyde@stjosephcamillus.org. These were false scamming emails.

Please note **I WILL NEVER ASK FOR GIFT CARDS IN AN EMAIL.** The only time we ask for gift cards here at St. Joseph's is through the Giving Tree. In that case one of the Angel Giving Tree ornaments will ask that you buy a gift card and drop it off at the parish. We never ask that you send a gift card over the internet. Sending a gift card over the internet is a classic scam.

If you receive an email from me that's not from one of the addresses above, it is a scam. Confirm any emails asking for a gift card by calling by phone here at the parish offices 315-488-8490.

So I wish you all a Happy and Healthy New Year! And keep an eye out for scammers!
