Lent is coming! So instead of more about Kenya (I'll get back to that next week), I will inform you about some exciting spiritual programs we're offering as a parish this Lent.

Adoration Chapel Reopening! We will be opening up our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel! It has been closed since COVID began. A number of people have volunteered to commit to adoration on a regular basis, but anyone will be free to stop in for some time with Jesus during the adoration hours.

The chapel will reopen on **Thursday, Feb. 23rd at 9:30 AM**. The chapel will be open for adoration **Monday – Friday 9:30 AM to 3:00 PM**. Our First Thursday adoration and benediction in the church will continue and the chapel will be closed for those times (First Thursdays 9:30 AM to 6:00 PM concluding with Benediction).

If attendance is good, we will look to expand adoration hours.

Please take advantage of this easily available prayer. Being with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is a way to deeply pray. Simple prayer becomes deeper, the Rosary opens up the mysteries of salvation, meditation yields guidance and peace, it's the spiritual equivalent of breathing pure oxygen! The adoration chapel will remain open after Lent.

Book Group with Fr. Hyde: This group will meet with me on **Tuesdays at 6:30 PM in the Upper Room**. We will read and discuss the new book **Everyday Miracles of Lourdes** by Marlene Watkins. Our first session will be on **Tuesday, February 28th at 6:30 PM** in the Upper Room. Marlene Watkins, a Syracuse native, is the author of this book. She is the foundress of Our Lady of Lourdes Hospitality North American Volunteers, a Catholic charity and lay association dedicated to spreading the message of Our Lady of Lourdes and helping bring pilgrims to Mary's shrine in Lourdes, France. Two decades of holy encounters inspired the writings of these twenty true, life-changing experiences of Lourdes. Marlene shares the astounding real-life stories of love, suffering, and brokenness transformed through graces from the Grotto.

Sessions are weekly, the last on March 28th.

This is a hope-filled and inspiring book! I can't wait to read it with others!

Deacon Nick announces **Theology Thursdays** for Lent, with two programs, one morning program and one in the evening:

Bible Study with Bishop Barron and Deacon Nick! Bishop Barron is the founder of Word on Fire, a Catholic Evangelization website. He is an exciting speaker and explainer on the Bible. Deacon Nick has studied the Bible for years at Georgetown University, he loves the Bible

and is a great guide to Scripture. The Bible study will be on **Thursdays at 9:30 AM in the Upper Room**. Sessions will begin with a video of Bishop Barron, followed by discussion. Sessions begin on **Thursday, March 2nd at 9:30 AM** in the Upper Room. Fair warning, I've volunteered to be Deacon Nick's substitute, if needed! Sessions are weekly, the last on March 23rd.

The Chosen: Selected Episodes! This highly successful series on Jesus and the Apostles has attracted millions of viewers. **Thursdays at 6:30 PM in the Upper Room** watch a specially selected Chosen episode followed by small group discussion, food and fellowship. Sessions are weekly, the last on March 23rd.

I plan to attend these, but I won't be able to attend all of them, and that's OK. Theology Thursday is deliberately set up so you can come to one, a few, or all. My book group is the same, although you may want to check what chapters of the book we will be discussing when you attend.

Lastly, an oldie but a goodie: **Stations of the Cross, Fridays, 6:00 PM in church**. Joining our Savior in his way of suffering for sinners is a great way to join our hearts to Jesus. All services (except for Living Stations on Good Friday) end with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Join us! This is also an experience when you can join us for one, a few, or all!

I hope everyone makes this Lent a time of rededication to prayer, fasting and almsgiving, renewing our faith and commitment to our Savior, Jesus! Please use these opportunities to enrich your Lenten Journey.

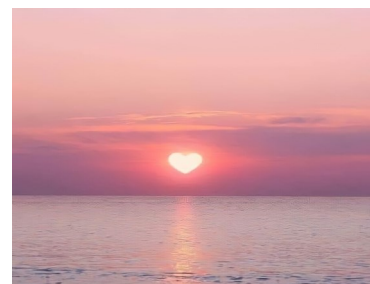
