Joseph's Workbench

Have you ever seen a lion? I have, of course, in a zoo here in the USA, and in a wildlife park in Florida (Disney World). However, it's very different seeing lions in their own habitat, in the wild in Africa! In Kenya I saw many things I'd never thought I'd see. Elephants with their babies in the wild (we have an elephant with twin babies at the Syracuse zoo!), lions snoozing under a tree only a few yards away, and the reality of how lions get their food!

The national parks of Kenya and Tanzania, neighboring countries, share the same ecosystem and the animals have no reason to respect the borders of each country. The combined area of the parks has more territory than the whole state of Connecticut! I found all the animals fascinating, but here are my favorites:

Lions: Getting up close to lions snoozing under a tree while inside an SUV makes one a little nervous! Our guide/ driver assured us that the lions had all eaten earlier in the day and couldn't smell us above the gas fumes of our fuel. What most fascinated me was how much the lions reminded me of house cats. They had much the same mannerisms and expressions on their faces, as well as the same way of licking and cuddling each other. The only difference was they were 250 to 350 pounds and 5'3" to 6'10" long!

The most fascinating experience I had with them was watching them hunt. Early in the morning our guide got word that a Cape buffalo had been wounded by a pride of lions. We went to the area and waited two hours with other park visitors as the lions patiently waited. The buffalo's herd were protecting it, hoping it would recover. Eventually the other buffaloes realized the wounded one would not recover, and they wandered off until only one was left to protect the wounded one. Then the lionesses moved in and chased the lone protector buffalo off, they attacked the wounded buffalo, killing it in a few moments.

Giraffes: I saw a lot of these animals and I was amazed they could move at all, they looked so ungainly! Yet they even manage to run!

Leopards, cheetahs, and hyenas are amazing. I was impressed by how they could hide in plain sight, I'm sure they surprise their prey that way!

Elephants are so impressive, not only are they big but they eat everything from grass to tree branches!

Rhinoceroses are built like tanks! Baraka, a blind rhinoceros, was cared for in his own 1,000-acre enclosure at a game reserve we visited. Baraka let us pet him, after feeding him a leafy branch! His hide felt like very rough leather.

Seeing all these wildlife in their natural habitat was amazing! It wasn't a zoo, this is where they lived, ran, flew, fed and hunted! It's an experience I will remember for the rest of my life!

Yet the most amazing experience of my trip was Sunday Mass at the two parishes I was at on my weekends in Kenya. I cannot express how impressed I was by the singing, prayer and friendliness of the people of each parish. I have a video of one parish Mass (three hours long) that I hope to share soon on our parish website.

All I can say is that the people of Kenya have a much tougher life than we Americans, but they are close to God and filled with hope. I know we are so blessed here in the USA, but I hope we can express our gratitude to God for all our blessings as strongly as the people of Kenya.

Lenten Regulations

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd.

Lenten regulations are as follows: Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, *all* Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Those younger than 18 and over 59 whose health allows it are strongly encouraged to follow these regulations. These minimal penitential practices should not be lightly excused.

It is also expected that the faithful commit themselves to extra prayer, almsgiving, and self denial during this holy season.

Stewardship of time is one of the three interlinked dimensions of our call to stewardship. Just as with our financial resources, we talk about spending time, saving time, and wasting time. 20 minutes on "other activities"
