Joseph's Workbench

"I saw it on the radio!" This seemingly absurd slogan was used by public radio many years ago. I often think of it when I'm listening to an audiobook on a long drive. I've been listening to audiobooks for a very long time. I remember when they were on cassette tapes and I miss the satisfying clucking sound they'd make when you'd slide a new cassette into the car stereo. Now the audiobooks are on my cellphone and through the magic of "Bluetooth", my cellphone can play over my car stereo.

One of my first audiobooks was not a book at all, it was a radio play, Star Wars, with most of the original cast acting out the movie for National Public Radio. There were sound effects and extra parts of the story that had to be cut from the movie. "I saw it on the radio!" That strange slogan made sense to me because, in my mind's eye, my imagination reproduced and even surpassed the special effects of the movie.

This feat of the imagination does not just exist for radio plays. I am listening right now to a murder mystery set in an old house in Bar Harbor, Maine. The audiobook is simple narration, two female narrators, and there are no sound effects. Nevertheless, I can see the creepy mansion on a hilltop overlooking the ocean. I have already imagined what each character looks like! I wonder if they do a movie of it whether my imaginary figures will at all resemble the flesh and blood actors in the movie.

While I recommend listening to audiobooks, at home, in the car, while walking, etc., that is not why I'm writing this column. The same act of imagination that can transport you to Tatooine or Bar Harbor can also bring you closer to God. Lent is a perfect time to practice scriptural, or biblical, meditation.

What scriptural meditation consists of is listening to or reading a Bible passage and imagining it in your mind. This works best with episodes in the Bible like David and Goliath, the birth of Jesus, one of the healings of Jesus, or the crucifixion. Once you've listened to or read the Bible passage, go through it again and imagine yourself in the scene. You might be Goliath's shield bearer watching in astonishment as your master is struck down by a kid with a sling. Or you might be Mary Magdalene or John at the foot of the Cross hearing the seven last words of Jesus.

The mind's eye, your imagination, can transport you into the scripture passage. You can begin to experience God's word by living it out in your heart with the help of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes this can happen at Mass as well, or at the Stations of the Cross, which is a meditation on the death of Jesus.

As I said above, you can simply read the passage to yourself, or read it aloud, or have someone read it to you, all of these can help you meditate on the scriptures. Audiobooks of the Bible do exist, some with famous narrators, Charlton Heston, for instance, so these can help you meditate too.

Lent is not just a time of spiritual aerobics exercises, prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is also a time of remembering, putting us back together with God in our present lives. When we meditate on the scriptures we begin to see the connection with what happened then to what I'm living now. I may not be Goliath's shield bearer, or a shepherd boy at the birth of Jesus, or St. John at the crucifixion, but God has something to say to me in all their experiences.

"I saw it in the Bible!" That might be a good slogan for a good prayer experience this Lent.
