Joseph's Workbench

The incident is a family legend, I think it's true, I received it firsthand from my father, Bob Hyde. My father worked most of his adult life in the beer industry, he started out as a young executive working in the American division of Carling Black Label. One day his boss boasted that their beer tasted the same from each of its breweries, a drinker couldn't tell which bottle came from which brewery. My father objected, saying there was a difference, a bet was proposed, the challenge accepted, and a blind taste test arranged. The bottles were lined up, their labels covered, and my father tasted each bottle and assigned a brewery to each. His score was 100%! My dad always finished this story by saying he had learned two valuable lessons from that challenge. First, he had an excellent sense of taste, second, don't win a bet with your boss!

I thought of this story because of a book I'm reading, "Dinner With The President: Food, Politics, and a History of Breaking Bread at the White House," by Alex Prud'homme. The book is a fascinating tour of American history centered on food and how it has influenced presidential politics and diplomacy. Alex Prud'homme's grandfather was the twin brother of Julia Child's husband, she of "The French Chef" television show and coauthor of the famous cookbook, "Mastering the Art of French Cooking."

In the book there is much about how food can influence people in ways that make possible agreement, compromise, or, at least, respectful disagreement. Many presidents, from Washington to Jefferson, to today have used food as a way to smooth over the conflicts of politics and diplomacy. One of my favorite stories in the book is when Jefferson, Hamilton, and Madison met for dinner in New York City in the "room where it happened", and forged a compromise that resulted in the eventual founding of Washington, D.C. and the federal government paying off all the states' debts from the Revolutionary War.

Mr. Prud'homme makes a distinction between two types of people who love food, the gourmet and the gourmand. Both love food but there is a difference. The gourmet loves food, has excellent taste and yet is able to enjoy food in moderation. Presidential examples of gourmets are Thomas Jefferson and Franklin Roosevelt. A gourmand may have excellent taste as well, but cannot enjoy food in moderation. An example of the gourmand is Theodore Roosevelt, who could really pack it away and only staved off obesity through a disciplined exercise regimen.

It may seem strange to write about food in the middle of Lent, when we abstain, fast, and give up favorite treats. Yet I think there is a spiritually useful distinction between the gourmet, loving food but not ruled by it, and the gourmand, unable to moderate consumption. Jesus was criticized as a glutton, drunkard, and worse because he ate with sinners. He was not abandoning his principles by eating with those who were guilty, instead he was trying to win them over to a better way, the way of the good news. He used food to open up the hearts and minds of his fellow diners to God's grace. And, of course, Jesus would eventually give us the sacrificial meal of the Eucharist where he comes to us in his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity under the forms of bread and wine.

How can we avoid the excesses of the gourmand and use food for God's purposes as well as our human need for nourishment? I submit to you that we should all cultivate a good sense of taste.

What do I mean by that, should we all aspire to my dad's level of distinguishing between different breweries? Of course not. And some of us cannot get there. One of the most amusing contrasts in the book is between Franklin Roosevelt, a true gourmet, and his wife, Eleanor, who only viewed food as fuel, not caring about taste.

We may not be able to prefer coq au vin to chicken nuggets, but we can appreciate how important the difference is to others. Perhaps we might call that spiritual taste. Just like bottles of beer are not interchangeable we can "taste" the concerns of others, whether it's for a good meal or some companionship and concern from you across the table.

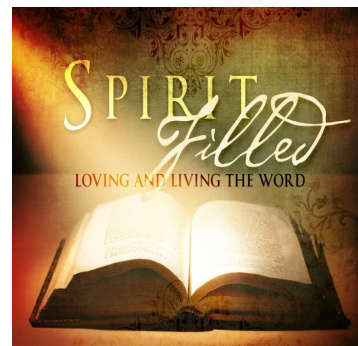
Perhaps one Lenten, or maybe better, Eastertide project can be to prepare a good meal for someone we know who needs our support. Prepare a meal suitable for their tastes, whether it's boeuf bourguignon or a Big Mac. Also, be prepared to "taste" the spiritual hungers of that person and offer a portion of the Gospel that will whet their appetite for more of the same. *(continued)*

My dad found that he could show off his sense of taste but learned that it put off the very person he meant to impress. He learned his lesson, the person next to you at the bar or the banquet table is also someone you have to have a discerning palate to welcome and nourish, not all taste is for food.

May we find a way to spread a table that feeds the spirit as well as the stomach, just as Jesus did. Let's all be soulful gourmets. Bon Appetit!
