

Joseph's Workbench

Yet it was our infirmities that he bore,
our sufferings that he endured,
while we thought of him as stricken,
as one smitten by God and afflicted.
But he was pierced for our offenses,
crushed for our sins;
upon him was the chastisement that makes us whole,
by his stripes we were healed.
We had all gone astray like sheep,
each following his own way;
but the LORD laid upon him
the guilt of us all. (Isaiah 53:4-6)

Some Bible passages become a part of us, like the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father, they sink into our hearts and help us understand God, life, and what's really important. The passage above is read on Good Friday and is a part of our Stations of the Cross service on Fridays during Lent. It speaks to me of all that Jesus did for us by his suffering and Cross.

I recommend reading Isaiah 53 this Holy Week on your own as well as going to our Paschal Triduum liturgies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. These liturgies are a way of opening up your heart to Jesus and experiencing all he has done for you, for all of us.

If you can't come to the Triduum, or even if you can, a great way to experience the wonder of the love of Jesus is to listen to the famous oratorio "Messiah" by Georg Friedrich Handel. The passage above and others take us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and on to our heavenly destiny. The most famous part of the oratorio is the "Hallelujah Chorus" (which we can't do in church during Lent, but it's OK to listen to it at home or in a concert hall!), but I would say the passages about the suffering of Christ and the promise of eternal life ("The trumpet shall sound and we shall be changed") are even more powerful in some ways than the Hallelujah Chorus.

You don't have to buy a CD or an mp3 to listen to it, you can view a concert on Amazon Prime or other streaming services. The lyrics, to help you follow along, are available online as well.

A few years ago there was a Gatorade commercial showing athletes with blue, orange or red perspiration on their faces, the various colors of flavors of Gatorade. The slogan of the commercial was, "Is it in you?", a tribute to the dedication and grit of athletes (and Gatorade as the way to fuel their efforts).

We might ask the same question about the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, "Is it in you?" Reading the Bible passages about Jesus, or listening to them being sung in a musical masterpiece like "Messiah", are a way to let the reality of all Jesus said and did sink into us, become part of us.
