Joseph's Workbench

When I think of what made me who I am today I think of faith, prayer, attendance at Mass on Sundays, and my education. Good teachers and good books I read on my own also had a lot to do with my vocation and my academic and personal success.

I seldom think about my family as the reason I am who I am today. Yes, I know that my Mom and Dad had a lot to do with who I am today, but I tend to think of that as a given. I don't usually recognize that they had a real impact on my future.

The reality is though, that family structure and stability have a lot to do with young peoples' future success in life, especially boys. Living in a two parent, stable home is more important for a boy, and young man's future than income, neighborhood or the school he attends. Girls are affected too by lack of family stability, but much less so than boys.

And boys are not doing well, fewer and fewer young men are working or attending college as young adults, much less graduating from high school.

A psychologist, Robert Kim Henderson, who writes articles on this subject, and was himself raised in foster homes, brought these statistics to my attention. He barely graduated from high school and only went on to college because a sympathetic male teacher, who saw something in him, convinced him to enlist in the United States Air Force. The armed forces standardized test for recruits uncovered his high intelligence and the discipline of the military helped him to succeed there and at Yale and Cambridge University later on.

Mr. Henderson's experience and psychological studies convinced him that boys and young men need rules, discipline, guidance and male role models who live those qualities themselves.

All of these necessary qualities are part of our faith. My parents weren't perfect, but they gave me and my three sisters and brother a loving home. We knew we were loved by them and God. Discipline and rules were a part of life, so was laughter and lively conversation (my Dad loved to debate about anything).

I hope all our parents, whether they're married or single, know what a crucial job they are doing. God is on the side of mothers and fathers, that's why honoring them is one of the Ten Commandments.

So, say, "Thanks Mom & Dad!", either personally if they are still with you, or like me, in prayer if they are not. A good home is a great head start for any kid.
