# Joseph's Workbench

Last weekend and this one are big ones in our parish life. Our First Communion students received Jesus in the Holy Eucharist last weekend for the first time. This weekend they make an encore appearance at each regular weekend Mass for the May crowning of Mary. We also have the Confirmation Mass for our teens who are being confirmed this Sunday at 2:00pm by Bishop Robert Cunningham.

By an interesting coincidence (are there any coincidences where God is involved?) this weekend also has two momentous events on Saturday, May 6<sup>th</sup>. Father Cleophas Tuka, a priest of the Diocese of Nakuru, Kenya who ministered in the Syracuse Diocese for a number of years, will be ordained the new bishop of Nakuru. I ministered with Father Tuka and he hosted me for part of my trip to Kenya in January, before we knew he would be the new bishop. The other momentous event is, of course, the coronation of King Charles III of the United Kingdom in Westminster Abbey in a ceremony that stretches back over one thousand years to the coronation of King Edgar of England in A.D. 973.

How can you compare "ordinary" First Communions and Confirmations to the momentous events that are a Bishop's ordination and a King's coronation? Well, all these events, even the "ordinary" ones celebrated here in Camillus, are life changing for the recipients and for the world.

A bishop is ordained in the line of apostolic succession going all the way back to the Apostles themselves. Bishop Tuka will become responsible for teaching the Gospel, sanctifying God's people through the sacraments, and protecting by wise governance his Diocese of Nakuru, Kenya.

King Charles III will join a line of kings and queens going back to at least Alfred the Great (died A.D. 886). Some of those kings and queens were good, some bad, the same can be said of bishops of the past, but he will pledge to be good. King Charles has said his model as king will be his mother, Queen Elizabeth II, whose dutiful service as queen lasted until her death.

Our young seven- and eight-year-olds who received their First Holy Communion last weekend also made a great pledge to God. They received Jesus with a child's faith, beginning a deep living relationship with Jesus that will be fed by his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist. I speak from experience since my First Holy Communion was life changing. Receiving Jesus, and living out their faith in Jesus, these children will change the world for the better as much as any bishop or king. Pray for them that they keep receiving that gift of Jesus in Holy Communion throughout their lives.

Our Confirmation students will receive the Holy Spirit from Bishop Cunningham through the laying on of hands and the anointing with holy chrism. This reception of the Holy Spirit will aid them in living out their promise to follow Jesus as active Christians. They have prepared for two years for this step, and we need to pray for them as they take this step into spiritual maturity.

Confirmation, the Ordination of a Bishop, and the British Coronation Rite, all include anointing. This Biblical action of placing oil (usually olive oil, although other vegetable oils may be used) on the head of someone goes back to King Saul and King David in the Old Testament. They were anointed by the prophet Samuel when they were chosen to be king by God. King Solomon was anointed as his father, King David's successor by Zadok the High Priest and Nathan the Prophet. The anthem "Zadok the Priest" with words from the Bible and music by George Frederick Handel will be sung at King Charles's coronation.

Each one of us, whether bishop, king, child, teen, or adult, is chosen in Baptism, fed in the Eucharist, and anointed in Confirmation by the Holy Spirit to believe in Jesus, live our faith in Jesus, and do good in the world. Remember your First Communion, remember your anointing and live your faith.
