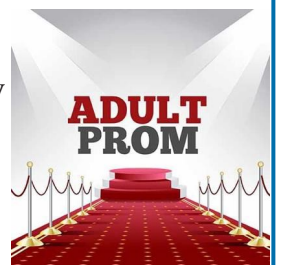


Raffle Baskets for our Adult Prom: Parish we need your help!
