Joseph's Workbench

Where is our culture going? How can Catholics be true to our faith in a time when society is more and more diverse and less tolerant of Catholic values like sacramental marriage, chastity, and respect for the sanctity of life?

Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Exhortation, “REJOICE AND BE GLAD” (also called *Gaudete et Exsultate*), asks us to live out our Catholic faith in the world. We may face misunderstanding, even discrimination, in living out our faith, but we should still rejoice, because we are very close to Jesus in such times.

Pope Francis gives an example of how to live out the Gospel:

“This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures. Here is an example: a woman goes shopping, she meets a neighbour and they begin to speak, and the gossip starts. But she says in her heart: “No, I will not speak badly of anyone”. This is a step forward in holiness. Later, at home, one of her children wants to talk to her about his hopes and dreams, and even though she is tired, she sits down and listens with patience and love. That is another sacrifice that brings holiness. Later she experiences some anxiety, but recalling the love of the Virgin Mary, she takes her rosary and prays with faith. Yet another path of holiness. Later still, she goes out onto the street, encounters a poor person and stops to say a kind word to him. One more step.”

I recommend this exhortation to everyone, it is available online. Pope Francis wants us to know that we all have the potential to live out God’s call in our lives. The opportunity to change the world for the better is right there in front of us. Francis is insistent that we need both prayers and actions to be holy. We must join together to make a difference in the world.

What we most need in these confusing times is hope. “REJOICE AND BE GLAD” offers hope that we are all called to holiness and can make a difference against the evils in the world today.

Let us renew our quest for holiness along with Pope Francis today.
