

Joseph's Workbench

This Sunday is my 35th anniversary as a priest! I'm preaching, so I will go into the spiritual aspect of priesthood in my homily. In this column I'd like to write about the personal aspect of priesthood. I know we priests are odd ducks in the modern world. So I hope to humanize the priestly life a bit by the simple questions journalists are supposed to ask in their articles (they don't always do this): Who? What? Where? When? How?

Who am I, and how did I end up a priest? I'm the second of five children, my father was a businessman in the beer industry, my mother a homemaker. I have three sisters, one older, and one brother, the youngest. My upbringing was a normal 60's and 70's suburban upbringing, my siblings and our neighbor kids thrown out of the house to play on vacations and weekends. I had a very happy childhood.

You might expect that my family was very religious and that I went to Catholic schools for my entire education. Well, my family prayed grace at meals, and we went to church on weekends and holy days. I didn't think this was very religious, but later realized to some people that made us very devout! My education was almost exactly half at Catholic schools and half at public schools. I got a good education at both types of school, but I think the Catholic schools were somewhat better. I was an altar boy (when there were no girl servers!), and I think this did foster a vocation, I was fascinated by Mass and especially the Holy Week liturgies.

My mother always told the story that when I was in 2nd grade, around First Communion time, I was in the car with her and said I would be a priest when I grew up and me and my wife would take care of the church! My mom had to explain that this was not how things worked. I have no memory of this, and don't remember thinking seriously about priesthood until I was 13 years old. It certainly wasn't the only thing I was thinking about, but it was the one that kept coming back. My parents took the news calmly, telling me only that I should not do it to impress them! They would be happy if I chose something that made me happy.

One big impact on my life and vocation were the priests we had growing up. I did not move to the Syracuse area (Cazenovia) until I was 16, so the priests in our parishes in Michigan and Connecticut would be unknown to you, but we had some good ones. Great priests showed me something I needed to know, being a priest could be a happy and fulfilling life! Msgr. A. Robert Casey and Fr. Lou Aiello at St. James in Cazenovia certainly taught that, as did Fr. Philip Wilson and Fr. Matthew Stark at my high school, Portsmouth Abbey in Portsmouth, Rhode Island.

After graduating from high school I was pretty sure I wanted to be a priest, but I had some questions. Was this real? Did I just feel this way because I went to a Catholic high school that was also a monastery? Also, what type of priest would I be, a monk in a monastery, or a parish priest? I decided to test my vocation by going to a college, St. Lawrence University in Canton, NY, that was not Catholic. I talked with various priests and people about what type of priest I should be, especially, Fr. Matthew, the abbot of the monastery at my high school.

Obviously, I decided my call to the priesthood was real and that I should be a parish priest. Prayer and lots of interaction with priests, family, and friends confirmed my call to the priest-hood for me. Of course, I also had to be accepted, the call to any ministry, especially priest-hood, comes first in your heart and then from the Church, the priests, people and bishop who have to decide if you are cut out for priestly ministry.

I can't go further with the story, except to say I, and I hope the Church, made the right choice. I've been very happy as a priest. I'd recommend it to any young man considering it. There have been challenges, there have been tough times, but every Mass, every great celebration with God's people, every chance to make a difference in someone's life, all of this makes me thank God I became a priest. The 35 years seem like they just flew by! I should add that the support, prayers and love of all the people of God I've served over the years have kept me going. Thank you!


