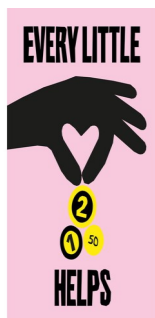

# Joseph's Workbench

## O Sacred Banquet

O Sacred Banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of his Passion is recalled, the soul is filled with grace, and the pledge of future glory is given us.

The above prayer is by St. Thomas Aquinas the great Dominican theologian who lived in from A.D. 1225 – 1274. It is remarkable for its brevity and, short though it is, the deep truths contained in it.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi in Latin. Right now all the bishops of the U.S.A. have asked for a Eucharistic Revival. Surveys have shown that many Catholics don't have an accurate faith in the Eucharist. They see the bread and wine after consecration at Mass as "symbols" of the body and blood of Jesus. To be clear, Catholics really believe that the Eucharist is the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus, as he is now, alive in Heaven. Yes, the Eucharist is symbolic, but it is also, under the forms of bread and wine, the real presence of Jesus among us. When we receive Holy Communion, we are receiving the living Jesus himself.

This is a mystery, we cannot understand it, we can only experience it. However the words of Jesus, "This is my body," and "This cup is the new covenant in my blood" make clear that he gives us his body and blood. The Gospel of John chapter 6 contains the Bread of Life discourse of Jesus, and he clearly states that his flesh is real food, and his blood is real drink.

However, to me the real reason Jesus gave us his body and blood is found in these words of Jesus from John, chapter 6: "Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me."

When we receive Jesus in the Eucharist we feed on him, our spirit, mind, character, our way of seeing the world, is changed because we are being nourished by the very life of Jesus.

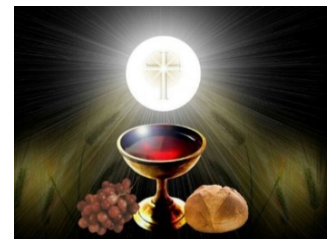
I think the lack of faith in the Eucharist shown in surveys comes from two sources. First, people aren't going to Mass and so are not receiving communion. You cannot believe what you do not experience. You have to receive Jesus in the Eucharist prayerfully, reverently, and faithfully. I have a spiritual saying about all our excuses for not going to Mass, we all know them, I'm tired, the music isn't great (not true at St. Joseph's), the sermons aren't great (well maybe sometimes), I'm too busy, and the worst one, I don't get anything out of Mass. My none too elegant response to these excuses? "Just shut up and go to Mass!"

The other source of a lack of faith in the Eucharist is found in the excuse, "I don't get anything out of Mass." My response to that is a question, "What are you bringing to Mass?" Are you bringing your hopes and fears, all the things you are grateful for, all the people you worry about? Are you hungry for the life of God within you? "Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me."

When we realize Jesus is there, willing to help us, be with us, feed us with his very life, well nothing will keep us away from Jesus in the Eucharist.

## Remembering ... Corpus Christi

Remembering and forgetting are very much part of our lives. We remember some people with a building... or a park... or a statue in their honor. Long ago the Egyptian Pharaohs built huge, stone pyramids to be Remembered.

Jesus also asked to be remembered. He asks us to remember his words.

- He wants us to remember his examples and sayings about mercy.
- He wants us to remember his welcome and open-table meals.
- He wants us to remember his words and his actions about the Kingdom of God.
- He wants us to remember his future Kingdom of heaven.
- He wants us to remember his command to love one another.
- He wants us to remember God's faithfulness to us in his death and resurrection.

Jesus gave specific instructions how we were to remember him. Before leaving this world He gathered his friends around a table, took the everyday food of those days – Bread and Wine – then said a blessing prayer and broke the bread.

He told his friends to share this food and drink. In this way they would remember Jesus – and make present God's faithfulness to us through his life-giving death and resurrection. He told them that they should do this regularly. Then early Christian communities met in homes to eat the bread and drink the wine.

Today we gather in buildings constructed specially for gathering and worship. We remember God's faithfulness to us in Jesus' death and resurrection. It still works. Jesus asked to be remembered – and He is. This very day here among us.

Hold on to three words from Sunday's readings.

First reading: **"Remember."** Remember where freedom comes from. Remember who stays with us when we're lost. Remember who feeds us when we're hungry, and who teaches us to be hungry for more than bread.

Second reading: **"Participating."** Saint Paul is not interested in the Corinthians worshipping the Eucharist. He's interested that they participate as equals in the Eucharist and in their community life with no distinctions between haves and have-nots. Eating the Lord's Supper is a sign of participating in the death of Jesus. Our body and blood, our life, *is* Christ's body and blood, shared with each other as freely as food around a table unfinished until it includes the world.

The Gospel word is **"life."** God's life, made transparent in Christ, and given away like manna to our lost and hungry world, is the outward movement of love that creates, heals, rescues, accompanies, and gives birth to meaning.

**Remember. Participate. Life.** For today, that is the Gospel message for the body of Christ, today.
