Joseph's Workbench

What does it mean to remember? Memory is a tricky thing. I have a memory of John F. Kennedy's funeral on television, I was three years old. It is probably my earliest memory. Do I really remember it? My Mom was crying, and I "remember" the funeral procession on the screen, but how much comes from my Mom and others recalling President Kennedy's funeral?

This weekend is Memorial Day weekend, and we will have a Mass on Monday at 8:00am (one hour earlier than usual so people can go to the parade). Memorial is a word associated with memory, it's right there in the word, but it doesn't necessarily mean personal memories, rather it means something that we must remember, because it is a part of us.

By the above definition the 4th of July is a memorial, Christmas is a memorial, any holiday is a memorial, the most obvious one being Thanksgiving when we remember all our reasons to be thankful to God. Memorial Day, however, means remembering all those who died in the service of our country. We are obliged to remember them because without their sacrifice we would not have the free country we are all a part of.

Yet these memories are not personal memories. I have never served in the military, most of us haven't, much less fought in a war. Nevertheless I wouldn't be here, living the life I am living without the sacrifice of those who served. Therefore, I have to remember and honor those who died, because they are a part of me, they made my life possible.

I do have memories of veterans I've known, my Dad, who served as a marine during the Korean War, he served in the US Virgin Islands as a gunnery officer, shipping munitions to Korea, and never saw combat. My grandfather, who served in the US Navy during World War I, he never left Boston, and worked as a barber. He was the first person diagnosed with the Spanish Flu in Boston.

Other veterans I knew were World War II veterans, my uncle, Larry Hyde, former naval officer, my scoutmaster in Darien, Connecticut, Mr. Foster, who landed at Normandy, Omaha Beach I believe. I also have ministered to countless veterans at the Syracuse VA Hospital in my 15 years as a substitute chaplain there.

This weekend we had the funeral of Mr. Henry Stamatel, 99 years old, a World War II veteran. I think his funeral Mass falling on Memorial Day weekend is very fitting.

You may not go to our Mass at 8:00 AM or the parade in the village. But whatever you're doing on Memorial Day, remember. Take the time to think, pray, remember those you've known who served, and speak about them to the family or friends you're with. On Thanksgiving we like to

go round the table and remember what we're thankful for. Perhaps you can do the same this Memorial Day, but instead remember someone who served, especially the ones who didn't make it home. Then, if you're at a meal or cookout, raise a glass and toast the honored dead.
